HONG KONG INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION FOR THE SAFE AND ENVIRONMENTALLY SOUND RECYCLING OF SHIPS, 2009

Accession by Germany

The Secretary-General of the International Maritime Organization has the honour to refer to the Hong Kong International Convention for the Safe and Environmentally Sound Recycling of Ships, 2009, and to state that accession by the Federal Republic of Germany was effected by the deposit of an instrument on 16 July 2019.

Pursuant to article 16(6) of the Convention, the instrument of accession by Germany was accompanied by the following declaration:

"The Federal Republic of Germany declares that Ship Recycling Plans shall be explicitly approved in all of its federal states (Länder) by the Competent Authority of the respective Land."

The conditions for entry into force of this Convention have not yet been fulfilled. Article 17(1) of the Convention provides the following:

"This Convention shall enter into force 24 months after the date on which the following conditions are met:

- .1 not less than 15 States have either signed it without reservation as to ratification, acceptance or approval, or have deposited the requisite instrument of ratification, acceptance, approval or accession in accordance with article 16;
- .2 the combined merchant fleets of the States mentioned in paragraph 1.1 constitute not less than 40 percent of the gross tonnage of the world's merchant shipping; and
- .3 the combined maximum annual ship recycling volume of the States mentioned in paragraph 1.1 during the preceding 10 years constitutes not less than 3 percent of the gross tonnage of the combined merchant shipping of the same States."



There are, at present, 13 Contracting States to the Convention, representing approximately 29.42¹% of the gross tonnage of the world's merchant shipping. The combined annual ship recycling volume of the Contracting States during the preceding 10 years is 1,729,478 GT, i.e. 0.44% of the merchant shipping tonnage of the same States.²
